Our curriculum-linked programs can enrich your classroom experience and support learning, right here in Peterborough and the Kawarthas!



ACTION

Bike Courses - GreenUP

A variety of bike courses available throughout the year; call us to find one that fits your needs.

On The Bus - GreenUP

On the Bus is a fun and interactive introduction to the Peterborough Transit System provided to Grade 3 classes in the city of Peterborough.

Pedal Power - GreenUP

Aims to build confidence and competence in young riders. Covers bike handling, traffic safety, and ride preparedness. Each child receives over six hours of on-bike instruction.

Making Connections: Climate Change 101 - KWIC

Using popular theatre and education-based activities, participants will explore the key concepts of climate change and the challenges and opportunities presented by climate change from a personal, local, and global perspective.

Seeing Yourself in a Changing World - KWIC

2-part workshop - explore how geographical and social identities shape our perspective of the world; we will illuminate how youth are powerful agents for social and environmental change through the concept of global citizenship.

Ecology Park - GreenUP

Programs include Pollen Power, The Great Water Migration, Soil/Erosion/Compost, Seasonal Changes, Plants/Trees/Seeds, Lifecycles, Insects, Wildlife in our City, Invader Raiders, Ecosystems, Food, Power & Alternative Energy

Mishiikenh - Turtle - TRACKS

Program begins exploring turtles through habitat, physiognomy, threats, and ways we can help them and leads to storytelling and traditional Indigenous calendars. Join us to find out how to tell the thirteen moons on a turtle's back!

Mtigwaaki - Forest- TRACKS

The forest is considered the natural kitigan (garden) to Anishinaabe people, and is the place where traditional materials for building, medicine, food, clothing can be found. We'll explore Ecology as a series of relationships through teachings, stories and games.

Environmental Education - Camp Kawartha

Looking for hands-on, curriculum based programming about the environment? Over 80 programs offered, teaching students about Ecology, sustainable living, and leadership.

Making Connections: Climate & Food Waste - KWIC

Using hands-on activities, participants will get creative (and maybe dirty!) while exploring the impact of food waste on the climate and our water and the importance of reducing food waste through individual and system solutions.

PCWF - GreenUP | May 31 & June 1, 2017

The Peterborough Children's Water Festival works in partnership with educators, water quality specialists, community, conservation groups, industry, and government to create a festival of activities that are educational and fun for children

Wonders of Water (WOW) - GreenUP

WOW is an extension of the PCWF, which includes 3 facilitated classroom programs (Primary, Junior and Intermediate) and 3 non-facilitated community bins that groups can borrow for 1 week at a time.

Climate Change & Water - KWIC

An intro to climate change through local and global water issues. From watersheds to ocean acidification students explore effects of climate change on water sources with an interactive local watershed display and science experiments!

G'Chi-Nibi - Sacred Water- TRACKS

Youth will learn about Anishinaabe perspectives on water and consider their own relationship to water through storytelling and hands-on activities.

Be a Watershed Steward - Camp Kawartha

In partnership with Otonabee Conservation, students learn about protecting watersheds and sustainable living and put knowledge into action by planting a pollinator garden in their own schoolyard as way to enhance watershed health.

Ode'min - Strawberry- TRACKS

Celebrate Ode'min Giizis (Strawberry Moon, or June) anytime of the year as we learn about this traditional food and what it can teach us about communication. We explore basic genetics as form of knowledge-transfer through a fun DNA extraction activity.
